At the request of many members, WRRRA has been in contact with Sanral in an attempt to reduce street lighting past the Caltex Garage on the N2. Unfortunately it would appear that variations in light fittings present technical problems, thus inhibiting any such possibility.

The Association is still waiting for Eden Municipality to clear away the debris caught under the Hoekwil Road Bridge last year. Anchorage Lane residents have approached Spoornet to likewise clear the debris away from under the Touw River railway bridge, in an effort to reduce the likelihood of possible flooding. Municipal rates accounts have been posted out, and residents are urged to examine these carefully for any anomalies. e.g. refuse removal charges for empty erven. Also bear in mind that although many objection adjustment advices have been received by residents, if the variation from the roll is greater than 10%, then the account will continue to show the value on the roll until the appeal board has ratified the adjusted value. Parents are warned to carefully monitor the recreational activities of teenage children, particularly over weekends, when drugs are freely available at many venues.
